

1 Samuel 16:7 The Lord does not see as man sees; for man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart.

A woman who was a regular attender in her church had been trying to get her husband to come to church with her. She had never been able to even get him to

think seriously about going to church. She was so persistent that finally he gave in to her. The two of them were sitting together during the service when offering time came around. The man reached into his back pocket and got out his wallet to pull out a dollar bill only to tine that all he had were twenty dollar bills. Not wanting to embarrass himself by putting his wallet away and not pulling anything out of it, he finally placed the twenty into the offering plate. When the man and his wife got home he waw angry. He told his wife that he waw going to put a dollar in and had nothing but twenties. After he had blown his stack for a while the man said, "Well, at least God gave me credit for twenty dollars." His wife turned and said, "No, God gave you credit for the dollar."

Although the Bible doesn't teach that God gives credit it does teach that God knows the heart. Even though the man gave twenty dollars, God knew he only wanted to give one.

What kind of "credit" would God give us on Sunday morning? Not just for stewardship, but for coming to worship. Why do we attend church? Is it because we have always done so? Is it because we feel we have an obligation to God? Do we feel we owe God something because he has saved us? Do we come to church because it is expected of us by someone else?

When we come to church we don't do it so the preacher can look good in the community or among his peers. We do it because of who God is. Ruler of the universe. When we miss church we do not owe the preacher an apology, we owe God an apology. When we come to church and appear to be giving God twenty dollars worth of worship, we may be fooling man but we are not fooling God. He knows it's only worth a dollar.


