When was the last time you read the full story of Stephen in the book of Acts? It takes place over chapters 6 and 7. Stephen is a believer in Jerusalem. In chapter 6 is chosen to help make sure some of the orphans and widows are taken care of so they could continue the teaching they were doing. He was one of the 1st deacons of the church. He was filled with the holy spirit so much that he would go out and teach like the disciples did, as he was taking care of orphans and widows. He was so good at the work God was doing through him that the Sanhedrin, or the ruling body of the Jews, had him arrested and brought before them. Then, in Chapter 7, Stephen, who was brought before them, proceeded to preach the truth of Scripture, that everything from the beginning through the law of Moses points to Jesus being the Messiah. The Sanhedrin was so angered by this that they took him out of the city and stoned him to death.

The most interesting part of the story is what comes next; this is the catalyst for the spread of the Gospel from local in Jerusalem to spread it out into Judea and Samaria, because the Sanhedrin begins to persecute believers, forcing them to flee Jerusalem. If you have some time this week, read Acts 6 and 7, study the story of Stephen, as we look at the aftermath of his life on Sunday.

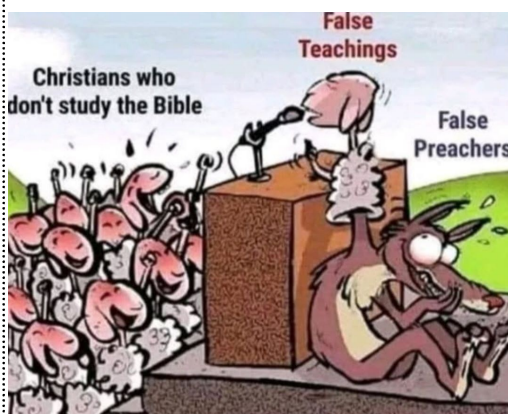

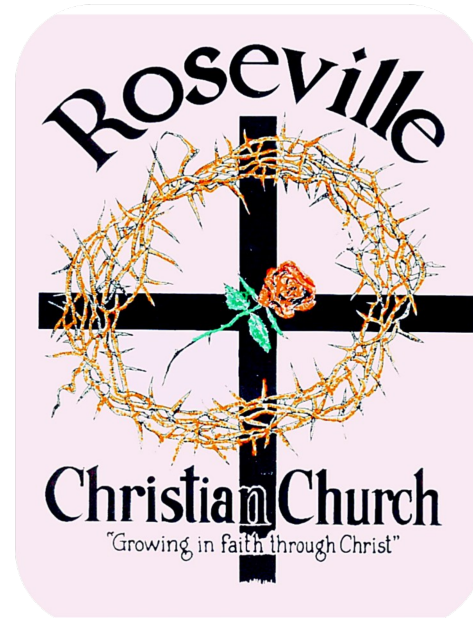
